Participants will experience the most up-to-date content, current educational best practices/strategies, and new digital integrations.

Academic Language and Literacy: Asset-Based Instruction for All Classrooms

(formerly titled Academic Language and Literacy Architects: Asset-Based Language Building)

Badge/Short Name: Academic Language & Literacy

The Academic Language and Literacy Community of Practice empowers elementary and secondary educators to enhance student engagement and promote access to content for multilingual learners and all who can benefit from targeted language development. This professional learning experience encourages educators to nurture students' backgrounds, experiences, and language by facilitating skill development in reading, writing, speaking, and listening. Educators will explore integrating AVID's college and career readiness skills through language-building routines and scaffolded instruction, enabling academic preparedness, opportunity knowledge, and student agency. After completing the Academic Language and Literacy Community of Practice, participants will be equipped to create equitable learning spaces that foster student voice development and promote active contribution in rigorous academic contexts. All strategies, digital activities, and digital tools experienced in this Community of Practice can be leveraged in face-to-face, blended, or virtual learning environments.

AVID District Director Leadership 1: Leadership Connection

Badge/Short Name: District Director Leadership 1

The AVID District Director Leadership (DDL) 1: Leadership Connection Community of Practice is the first professional learning experience of the four-part District Director Leadership series. This 6-hour learning experience establishes the foundation for the 1-year DDL professional learning journey. Participants will be introduced to the AVID College and Career Readiness Framework as a driver for AVID implementation and explore how the Continuous Improvement Cycle (Plan–Do–Study–Act) supports an increasingly impactful implementation over time. Team members will investigate the five district leadership priorities for AVID implementation (goal alignment, coaching implementation, professional learning, progress monitoring, and strategic collaboration and communication), which will be deepened and reinforced in the remainder of the DDL learning journey. Select foundational AVID implementation resources will be introduced with a focus on strategic use among AVID leaders. All strategies, digital activities, and digital tools experienced in this Community of Practice can be leveraged in face-to-face, blended, or virtual learning environments.

Prerequisite: This learning experience is for those designated as the four District Director Leadership Team members in the district's AVID contract.

AVID District Director Leadership 2: Maximizing Roles and Responsibilities

Badge/Short Name: District Director Leadership 2

The AVID District Director Leadership (DDL) 2: Maximizing Roles and Responsibilities Community of Practice focuses on the specific management roles of the AVID District Director. This 12-hour training is mandatory for District Directors and optional for district leaders supporting AVID implementation. Participants will revisit the AVID College and Career Readiness framework and five district leadership priorities for AVID implementation (goal alignment, coaching implementation, professional learning, progress monitoring, and strategic collaboration and communication), with a focus on roles and responsibilities unique to the District Director in managing AVID. Participants will explore select AVID resources designed to support District Directors in ensuring a strong AVID implementation at both the site and district level. All strategies, digital activities, and digital tools experienced in this Community of Practice can be leveraged in face-to-face, blended, or virtual learning environments.

Prerequisite: This learning experience is for those designated as the District Director in the district's AVID contract and have completed DDL 1.

AVID District Director Leadership 3: Leadership Reconnection

Badge/Short Name: District Director Leadership 3

The AVID District Director Leadership (DDL) 3: Leadership Reconnection Community of Practice is designed for the AVID District Director and AVID District Leadership Team to utilize the AVID College and Career Readiness Framework as a lens for supporting site-level implementation of the AVID College and Career Readiness System (ACRS). AVID District Leadership Teams will engage in a 12-hour training to reflect on and explore the AVID College and Career Readiness Framework to connect site implementation to district strategic plans and initiatives. Participants will utilize systems for progress monitoring and coaching as they visit AVID elementary and high school sites that demonstrate high expectations for all students using **Writing, Inquiry, Collaboration, Organization, and Reading (WICOR®)** to support rigor. District Directors will also engage in an additional 6-hour training to support the use of purposeful site visits that inform the work and provide opportunities to refine goals/action steps.

Prerequisite: This learning experience is for those designated as the four District Director Leadership Team members in the district's AVID contract and have completed AVID District Director Leadership 1: Leadership Connection and AVID District Director Leadership 2: Maximizing Roles and Responsibilities (DD only).

AVID District Leadership 4

Badge/Short Name: District Leadership 4

Offered at AVID Ignite and AVID Summer Institute

The AVID District Leadership 4 (ADL 4) Community of Practice engages those designated as the AVID District Director in the district's AVID contract. This fourth ADL training focuses on deepening leadership and expansion strategies related to the AVID College and Career Readiness Framework and schoolwide AVID implementation. District Directors will also engage in strategic planning to refine district implementation to build and sustain AVID sites. This session includes updates on AVID curriculum and initiatives to meet the needs of returning District Directors. All strategies, digital activities, and digital tools experienced in this Community of Practice can be leveraged in face-to-face, blended, or virtual learning environments.

Prerequisite: This learning experience is only for those designated as the District Director in the district's AVID contract and have completed ADL 1, 2, and 3.

AVID District Leadership 5

Badge/Short Name: District Leadership 5

Offered face-to-face and virtually in the fall of 2024 and spring of 2025

The AVID District Leadership 5 (ADL 5) Community of Practice engages AVID District Directors and district leaders in enhancing their AVID College and Career Readiness System (ACRS) for all students districtwide. Participants will network with other district leaders through professional learning and collaboration opportunities. The AVID College and Career Readiness Framework supports current district strategic plans, initiatives, and the essential role of district leadership in AVID implementation. This professional learning will focus on the direct impact of district leadership on high-quality AVID implementation. District practices that support AVID Schoolwide with a focus on rigorous academic preparedness, opportunity knowledge, and student agency are sustained through the four AVID Schoolwide Domains: Instruction, Systems, Leadership, and Culture. All strategies, digital activities, and digital tools experienced in this Community of Practice can be leveraged in face-to-face or virtual learning environments. This experience is designed for the District Director and two additional district leaders to attend as a team. The cost for all three team members to attend this training is included in the district contract.

Prerequisite: This learning experience is only for those designated as the District Director in the district's AVID contract and have completed ADL 1, 2, 3, and 4.

AVID Elective Level 1: Implementing the Fundamentals of Instruction

Badge/Short Name: AVID Elective: Implementing

The AVID Elective Level 1: Implementing the Fundamentals of Instruction Community of Practice supports middle and high school educators serving as new AVID Elective teachers or AVID Site Coordinators. Participants will be immersed in AVID Elective resources such as the AVID Weeks at a Glance curriculum (including tutorials) and research-based **W**riting, **I**nquiry, **C**ollaboration, **O**rganization, and **R**eading (WICOR®) strategies. All strategies, digital activities, and digital tools introduced in this Community of Practice can be leveraged in face-to-face, blended, or virtual learning environments.

Prerequisite: This learning experience is for new, contracted AVID Elective member sites for the upcoming school year and new AVID Elective educators and Site Coordinators at existing sites.

AVID Elective Level 2: Tutorials and Refining Implementation

Badge/Short Name: AVID Elective: Tutorials

The AVID Elective Level 2: Tutorials and Refining Implementation Community of Practice engages middle and high school AVID Elective educators and AVID Site Coordinators who previously attended professional learning for implementation of the AVID Elective. Participants will learn how to empower students to exercise their agency through the 10 Steps of the AVID Tutorial Process. Participants will deepen their use of WICOR® strategies and refine their use of resources, including the revised Weeks at a Glance curriculum and AVID Elective Standards. All strategies, digital activities, and digital tools introduced in this Community of Practice can be leveraged in face-to-face, blended, or virtual learning environments.

Prerequisite: This learning experience is for contracted secondary AVID Elective site members who have completed the first-year training AVID Elective Level 1: Implementing the Fundamentals of Instruction.

AVID Elective Level 3: Advancing Agency for Teachers and Students

Badge/Short Name: AVID Elective: Advancing

The AVID Elective Level 3: Advancing Agency for Teachers and Students Community of Practice is designed for middle and high school AVID Elective educators and AVID Site Coordinators who previously attended professional learning to implement and refine the AVID Elective. This Community of Practice will strengthen the implementation of the AVID Elective by supporting teachers in reflecting on how they currently implement WICOR® strategies, emphasizing educator and student agency, refining methodologies, and utilizing resources such as the revised AVID Weeks at a Glance, AVID Elective standards, and additional curriculum resources. All strategies, digital activities, and digital tools introduced in this Community of Practice can be leveraged in face-to-face, blended, or virtual learning environments.

Prerequisite: This learning experience is for contracted secondary AVID Elective site members who have completed the first- and second-year trainings AVID Elective Level 1: Implementing the Fundamentals of Instruction and AVID Elective Level 2: Tutorials and Refining Implementation.

AVID Elementary Implementation: PreK–2

Badge/Short Name: Elementary PreK–2

The AVID Elementary Implementation: PreK–2 Community of Practice engages primary educators new to AVID by exploring strategies and resources focused on the keys to successful implementation. Educators will gain an understanding of their role in an AVID Schoolwide system and how educator encouragement, modeling, and support of **Writing, Inquiry, Collaboration, Organization, and Reading (WICOR®)** strategies build the foundation for what students need for college and career readiness. All strategies, digital activities, and digital tools experienced in this Community of Practice can be leveraged in face-to-face, blended, or virtual learning environments.

Prerequisite: This learning experience is for new, contracted AVID Elementary member sites for the upcoming school year and new AVID Elementary educators and Site Coordinators at existing sites.

AVID Elementary Implementation: 3–6

The AVID Elementary Implementation: 3–6 Community of Practice engages educators new to AVID by exploring strategies and resources focused on the keys to successful implementation. Educators will gain an understanding of their role in an AVID Schoolwide system and how educator encouragement and monitoring of **Writing, Inquiry, Collaboration, Organization, and Reading (WICOR®)** strategies build the foundation for what students need for college and career readiness. All strategies, digital activities, and digital tools experienced in this Community of Practice can be leveraged in face-to-face, blended, or virtual learning environments.

AVID Excel Elective Level 1: Implementing the Foundations of Instruction

Badge/Short Name: AVID Excel: Implementing

The AVID Excel Elective Level 1: Implementing the Foundations of Instruction Community of Practice engages AVID Excel teachers, site administrators, and AVID District Directors who are new to AVID Excel®. This learning experience will support participants in implementing of the Foundations of Instruction and key components of the AVID Excel Elective and incorporating research-based instructional routines into lesson design and instructional delivery that will support academic language acquisition for long-term English language learners. Participants will begin to learn how to monitor and coach students and tutors in implementing rigorous Scholar Groups while maintaining a focus on academic language development. AVID Excel Elective Level 2: Scholar Groups and Refining Implementation

Badge/Short Name: AVID Excel: Scholar Groups

The AVID Excel Elective Level 2: Scholar Groups and Refining Implementation Community of Practice engages AVID Excel teachers, site administrators, and AVID District Directors. This learning experience focuses on deepening the implementation of foundational AVID Excel routines and instructional practices. Participants will learn to empower students through the 10 Steps of the AVID Excel Scholar Group Process to develop reading comprehension, text analysis, and language production skills. All strategies, digital activities, and digital tools experienced in this Community of Practice can be leveraged in face-to-face, blended, or virtual learning environments.

AVID Excel Elective Level 3: Advancing Learning and Language Routines

The AVID Excel Elective Level 3: Advancing Learning and Language Routines Community of Practice engages AVID Excel teachers, site administrators, and AVID District Directors who previously attended AVID Excel® professional learning. This learning experience will deepen participants' understanding of the Foundations of Instruction as a diagnostic tool for making informed and intentional decisions about instruction. Participants will further develop their skills as learning and language coaches in the AVID Excel classroom and apply those skills to lesson design. All strategies, digital activities, and digital tools experienced in this Community of Practice can be leveraged in face-to-face, blended, or virtual learning environments.

Building Academic Preparedness for College Credit Courses

Badge/Short Name: Academic Preparedness for College

The Building Academic Preparedness for College Credit Courses Community of Practice is designed for secondary and postsecondary educators of college credit courses (Dual Enrollment, Early College High School, Advanced Placement, International Baccalaureate, and postsecondary educators). Participants will engage with the AVID College and Career Readiness Framework and **W**riting, **I**nquiry, **C**ollaboration, **O**rganization, and **R**eadiness (WICOR®) strategies and learn how to utilize them to improve student readiness for college success. Participants will leverage higher-level thinking strategies to support all students while deepening their practices through the application of AVID Essential Skills. All strategies, digital activities, and digital tools experienced in this Community of Practice can be leveraged in face-to-face, blended, or virtual learning environments.

Career and Technical Education: Developing Employability Skills

The Career and Technical Education: Developing Employability Skills Community of Practice engages middle and high school level career and technical educators and program directors as they support their students in developing the skills necessary for current and future success. Participants will consider what future readiness looks like for their students and explore how AVID Instructional strategies can be embedded to foster and nurture student success. Educators will learn how to use **Writing, Inquiry, Collaboration, Organization, and Reading (WICOR®)** student-centered instructional practices and explore the framework of AVID Digital Learning: The 4 A's® to meaningfully integrate digital strategies to differentiate instruction and increase student agency. Participants will learn strategies to build connected communities through relational capacity activities to foster supportive and equitable learning spaces. Cultivating Writing Schoolwide — Elementary

Badge/Short Name: Writing Schoolwide: Elementary

The Cultivating Writing Schoolwide — Elementary Community of Practice engages and empowers PreK–6 elementary educators with foundational knowledge and strategies to increase skills and confidence in writing as a powerful tool in a 21st-century learning environment. Educators across all discipline areas will gain strategies for teaching the writing process, building an understanding of the academic modes of writing (persuasive, expository, narrative, and descriptive), and writing for a range of academic purposes. Participants will explore the power of metacognitive writing to cultivate literacy and student agency, with a focus on primary and intermediate learning environments. This collaborative experience allows educators to support learners in accessing rigorous content and writing like content experts. All strategies, digital activities, and digital tools experienced in this Community of Practice can be leveraged in face-to-face, blended, or virtual learning environments.

Cultivating Writing Schoolwide — Secondary

Badge/Short Name: Writing Schoolwide: Secondary

The Cultivating Writing Schoolwide — Secondary Community of Practice engages and empowers non-ELA secondary and postsecondary educators with knowledge and strategies to increase skills and confidence in writing as a powerful tool in a 21st-century learning environment. Educators across all discipline areas will gain strategies for teaching the writing process, building an understanding of the academic modes of writing (argumentative, expository, narrative, and descriptive), and writing for a range of academic purposes. Participants will explore the power of metacognitive writing to cultivate literacy and student agency. This collaborative experience allows educators, regardless of familiarity with writing instruction, to explore strategies to help students access rigorous content and write like content experts. All strategies, digital activities, and digital tools experienced in this Community of Practice can be leveraged in face-to-face, blended, or virtual learning environments.

Developing Critical Thinking: Computer Science Across Disciplines — Elementary (formerly titled *Implementing Computer Science in All Classrooms – Elementary*)

Badge/Short Name: Computer Science: Elementary

The Developing Critical Thinking: Computer Science Across Disciplines — Elementary Community of Practice, in collaboration with Amazon Future Engineer, aims to introduce computer science concepts to PreK–6 educators of all subject areas. Participants will learn to use computational thinking, a problem-solving approach that breaks down complex problems into manageable parts to support students’ metacognition and problem-solving skills. This Community of Practice will focus on the thinking processes of computer science applicable to elementary-aged students in all subject areas. All strategies, digital activities, and digital tools experienced in this Community of Practice can be leveraged in face-to-face, blended, or virtual learning environments.

Utilizing the 4 A's® AVID Digital Learning framework, participants explore instructional technology trends and delving into critical subjects like digital citizenship, responsible use, effective online research, and artificial intelligence (AI) in education. Participants will collaborate with their fellow educators to investigate how technology-rich environments nurture and elevate **Writing, Inquiry, Collaboration, Organization, and Reading (WICOR®)** skills. All strategies, digital activities, and digital tools experienced in this Community of Practice can be leveraged in face-to-face, blended, or virtual learning environments.

English Language Arts

Badge/Short Name: English Language Arts

The English Language Arts (ELA) Community of Practice engages ELA educators of grades 6–12 in intentionally integrating reading, writing, speaking, and listening to build the literacy skills necessary to access rigorous content. Participants will explore strategies necessary to critically read a variety of text types and consider how academic thinking skills and **Writing, Inquiry, Collaboration, Organization, and Reading (WICOR®)** can be used to design effective instruction. Participants will engage thoughtfully with the writing process to create and share ideas that will support deeper implementation of writing in the English Language Arts classroom, impacting students' ability to create and effectively share knowledge and innovative ideas. Throughout the learning, participants will experience speaking and listening strategies that foster a culture of literacy where students develop clarity and confidence with their voice. All strategies, digital activities, and digital tools experienced in this Community of Practice can be leveraged in face-to-face, blended, or virtual learning environments.

Enhancing School Community for College and Career Readiness for All

Badge/Short Name: Enhancing School Community

The Enhancing School Community for College and Career Readiness for All Community of Practice is intended for PreK–12 and postsecondary educators, counselors, and site leaders who are ready to strategically and intentionally enhance a school community that supports all students. We will dive deep into the AVID College and Career Readiness Framework and focus on what educators do to **Insist on Rigor, Break Down Barriers, Align the Work, and Advocate for Students**. The Foundations of Secondary Schoolwide Success Community of Practice is a foundational differentiated professional learning experience designed to engage educators in grades 6–12. This course is recommended for teachers of elective courses (i.e., the arts, physical education, etc.), world language teachers, special education teachers, and new or new to AVID instructional coaches. This course examines classroom strategies and methodologies that support the AVID College Career Readiness Framework and AVID Essential Skills schoolwide. Educators will learn the importance of disciplinary literacy, experience WICOR® in action, and understand how to craft learning experiences that support rigorous academic preparedness, student agency, and opportunity knowledge for their specific role on campus. Participants will experience and design learning around rigorous **Writing, Inquiry, Collaboration, Organization, and Reading (WICOR®)** methodologies to scaffold learning and promote critical thinking and analysis of source material. All strategies, digital activities, and digital tools experienced in this Community of Practice can be leveraged in face-to-face, blended, or virtual learning environments.

The Math Community of Practice engages 6–12 mathematics educators in the use of instructional practices. This Community of Practice builds on strategies that emphasize the use of **Writing, Inquiry, Collaboration, Organization, and Reading (WICOR®)** as learning tools for mathematics classrooms, and participants will be immersed in strategies to teach students how to read, write, think, and speak like mathematicians. Participants will explore the teacher moves necessary to empower students to engage deeply in mathematics, communicate their ideas, and connect their thinking to that of others. This learning experience will focus on the direct impact of district leadership on high-quality AVID implementation.
